welcome to Arts NC State

All NC State students – regardless of college or major – are welcome to participate in Arts NC State programs and productions, and to take arts courses for credit/non-credit.

What is Arts NC State?

Arts NC State is the collective voice of the six visual and performing arts programs at North Carolina State University: The Crafts Center, Dance Program, Gregg Museum of Art & Design, Department of Music, NC State LIVE and University Theatre.

Each year, Arts NC State provides hundreds of outstanding arts opportunities for both the campus and the greater community. Arts NC State is a part of the Division of Academic & Student Affairs (DASA).

How do I find out about all of the arts opportunities available on campus?

The Arts NC State website (arts.ncsu.edu) is updated year-round with news and events. On the website, you can sign-up to receive email reminders about events.

Connect with all of the arts programs on social media! See the individual program listings on the inside of this brochure for more info.

Does NC State offer arts majors?

Currently, majors are not offered in music, theatre or dance; however, students can obtain a minor in all three areas.

A **music minor** is offered with tracks in Performance, Composition or General Studies. The Department of Music is also home to the Arts Entrepreneurship minor. The **theatre minor** includes a combination of courses that address theatre in theoretical and practical contexts, while preserving an emphasis on application. A **dance minor** is offered through the Department of Health & Exercise Studies (learn more at go.ncsu.edu/danceminor).

Arts NC State auditions are open to all students, regardless of academic major or prior experience.

Music Auditions

Marching Band auditions

Marching Band auditions will be conducted by video submission during the summer. Videos are due by June 30 for drum line, by July 10 for brass and woodwinds, and by July 31 for color guard. A live audition option is available for students who do not have access to an instrument at this time. Visit music.arts.ncsu.edu/auditions for details.

Ensemble auditions

Audition formats and deadlines for other ensembles (choral, jazz, orchestral, concert bands and affiliated student ensembles) vary, and will either take place during the summer by video submission or live Zoom audition, or in-person during the first week of classes. Visit music.arts.ncsu.edu/auditions for specific requirements and deadlines for each ensemble.

Dance Auditions

The Dance Program runs two student dance companies, the State Dance Company and the Panoramic Dance Project. See inside panel for descriptions of each. This year the Dance Program will hold virtual auditions. Dancers can submit a video of themselves performing choreographed work or improvisation. Audition information is at dance.arts.ncsu.edu/auditions. Deadline is August 12.

Theatre Auditions

University Theatre will hold virtual auditions for *Argo*, a new adaptation of the Greek epic poem *Argonautica* that tells the story of Jason and the Argonauts. An audition orientation and interest meeting will be held the week of August 24. Virtual auditions will be accepted the week of August 31, and rehearsals will begin September 7. Check go.ncsu.edu/audition for additional information.

University Theatre auditions are open to all currently enrolled NC State students. You don't have to be a theatre minor – or even be taking a theatre class – to audition for a University Theatre production.

How do I become a member of the Dance Program's student dance companies?

This year the Dance Program will hold virtual auditions. Dancers will have the opportunity to submit a video of themselves performing choreographed work or improvisation. More information will be posted to dance.arts.ncsu.edu/auditions in mid-July.

What is the State Dance Company and the Panoramic Dance Project?

The State Dance Company and the Panoramic Dance Project are the academic dance companies of NC State, performing content-driven and research-based dance works choreographed by NC State Dance Program faculty and renowned national and local guest artists. The State Dance Company is the award-winning student company performing a distinguished collection of modern dance. The Panoramic Dance Project is an academic dance company presenting a variety of dance styles, including African, Latin, hip-hop, jazz, tap and modern. Each company performs annually in the Dance Program Fall Concert, presents a formal spring concert on campus and performs in other on and off-campus venues, including an American College Dance Association conference. Company members receive academic credit for participation.

Does the Dance Program offer academic classes for credit?

The Dance Program offers academic courses, including dance composition, hip-hop, and independent study in dance. The Department of Health and Exercise Studies also offers dance courses, most requiring no previous dance experience. Visit dance.arts.ncsu.edu for a full list of dance classes.

What kind of dance master classes can I take on campus for free?

This year the Dance Program will host both a live Master Class Series and an Online Master Class Series. Both will include a unique selection of dance classes taught by local, national and international artists. Live master classes scheduled for the fall semester include contemporary, hip-hop, bellydance, among others. Space will be very limited and registration is required. Online master classes will be both synchronous and asynchronous and will be updated regularly throughout the semester. For more information see dance.arts.ncsu.edu/master-classes.

Can I get a degree in dance?

A dance minor is offered through the Department of Health and Exercise Studies that intersects with the Dance Program. Learn more at go.ncsu.edu/danceminor.

What can I do at the Crafts Center?

Want a place to learn new skills and explore your creative side? Need a place to learn new technologies and build out your academic projects? Students can take non-credit courses and workshops in pottery, woodworking, jewelry, metals, photography, fiber arts, glass, calligraphy, lapidary, mixed media and more – all in a welcoming, informal learning environment. The Center's new CRAFT:LAB Digital Makerspace offers classes in software, lasercutting/engraving and professional practices. Studio passes are available for those with prior experience.

When do I sign up for classes?

Registration begins on Monday, July 27 for fall 2020 crafts classes, and Monday, November 16 for spring 2021 classes.

Are there activities just for NC State students?

Yes! The Crafts Center offers a variety of special classes and activities just for NC State students – special \$15 "CRAFTErnoon" sessions; activity sessions for residence hall groups and other campus organizations and clubs; and special "NC State students only" classes like building skateboards, bike repair and maintenance, and guitar lessons. The Center also hosts speakers and artists who provide specialty workshops and events.

Can I work for the Crafts Center?

Students interested in part-time work at the Crafts Center should contact Jo Ellen Westmoreland or Carol Fountain Nix. The Crafts Center hires students to work as front desk attendants, woodshop attendants, and pottery studio attendants. Student attendants get a free pass to the studio of their choice, which allows them to explore their own work and creativity.

What does the Gregg Museum collect and exhibit?

The Gregg Museum has well over 35,000 objects in its collection, including textiles, ceramics, furniture, industrial design, jewelry, sculpture, outsider/visionary art, folk art, photography, works on paper, ethnographic materials, Native American art, and fine craft objects. The Gregg organizes 6-8 exhibitions a year, some featuring the diverse permanent collection, others on a particular artist or thematic concept.

What exhibitions will be open in fall 2020?

- All That Glitters – Spark and Dazzle from the Permanent Collection
- All Is Possible – Mary Ann Scherr's Legacy In Metal
- Virtual tours of past exhibitions: gregg.arts.ncsu.edu/virtual-tours
- Deep Dive videos featuring individual objects from the collection, and tours of the collections area: gregg.arts.ncsu.edu/deep-dive-videos

What else can students enjoy at the Gregg Museum site?

All are welcome with free admission – please visit often! Currently enrolled NC State students are eligible for free membership in the Friends of the Gregg. Visitors can enjoy the beautiful outdoor spaces, which include a pollinator garden, a front lawn for relaxing or playing Frisbee, and outdoor sculpture. Be sure to visit on a windy day to see the Vollis Simpson whirligig in action on the front lawn!

How do I enroll in ensembles?

Some ensembles may be added during registration. For those requiring an audition, the instructor will enroll you after auditions have completed. Please keep the class time open in your schedule when registering for classes. All ensembles are one-credit academic courses, with the exception of affiliated student ensembles.

Who can take a music class?

Most music classes are open to all students regardless of major. The department offers a variety of courses for all levels and types of music interests including theory, composition, history, popular music, music technology and music industry.

Can I take private lessons?

The Department of Music offers music performance minors the opportunity to enroll in private lessons for credit in piano, guitar, voice and all orchestral instruments. Class study in piano and voice is open to all.

What curricular programs in music are available?

A minor is available in music with tracks offered in performance, composition and general studies. The Department of Music also offers a minor in arts entrepreneurship.

Are there any scholarships available?

A variety of scholarships are available to students in ensembles. Visit music.arts.ncsu.edu/scholarships for more information on how to apply through Pack ASSIST.

Do I have to take a theatre class to be in a University Theatre production?

No. University Theatre is NC State's student, volunteer theatre. All students are welcome to audition for an acting role, work behind the scenes in costuming, set design and construction, lighting, sound, or technical operations.

Where is University Theatre?

University Theatre's main production and performance spaces are in Thompson Hall, located on the corner of Dunn Avenue and Jensen Drive, next to the Coliseum Parking Deck. This facility is home to two theatres, Titmus Theatre and Kennedy-McIlwee Studio Theatre, plus costume and scenic shops, offices, classroom spaces and Ticket Central.

Where do I find theatre classes in MyPack Portal?

Is there a theatre major or minor?

Theatre classes are listed under THEATRE (THE). NC State does not offer a theatre major; classes are open to anyone who wants to learn about and participate in theatre. Information on the THEATRE minor program can be found at our website theatre.arts.ncsu.edu.

Student Art Sale & Visual Artist Award

Every April, Arts NC State hosts the Student Art Sale, offering full-time NC State students the opportunity to sell their original artwork. The sale is open to the public, and 100% of the proceeds go directly to the student artists. An outside judge selects a 2D, 3D, and a digital artwork for the Visual Artist Award.
