At NC State, dance, music and theatre auditions are open to all students, regardless of academic major or prior experience. In spring 2024, University Theatre will have auditions for *Ada and the Engine* on Jan. 25 and 26, and for this summer's TheatreFEST shows Feb. 22-24. Music auditions take place in the first week of classes. Most dance auditions take place at the beginning of fall semester, except for Panoramic Dance Project on March 27. Then you're in luck. The Gregg Museum of Art & Design (gregg.arts.ncsu.edu) organizes multiple exhibitions each year, some featuring artwork from NC State's diverse permanent collection of more than 50,000 objects, others on a particular artist or thematic concept. Where can I sell my artwork?

Each spring, Arts NC State hosts the Student Art Sale, open to all currently enrolled NC State students. This year's sale takes place on Friday, April 12, 2024 with an application deadline of March 31. See all details at go.ncsu.edu/studentart. You keep 100% of the sales and are eligible for visual artist awards in addition to your sales.

I'm a choreographer, composer or playwright.

All currently enrolled full-time NC State students are eligible to apply for the annual Creative Artist Awards (that come with cash prizes) for original work in dance, music and theatre. The deadline for dance and music entries is Monday, April 15, 2024. Theatre entries are due in the fall (date TBA). See all details at go.ncsu.edu/artawards.

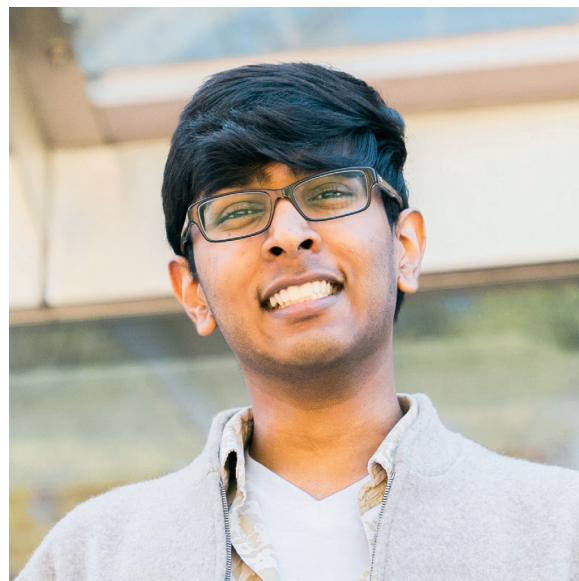
I love the arts. Where should I live on campus?
